

White Paper Reference : Mopar Wheel Weights
Revised 02-22-1999

The following are some examples of wheel weights that have been found on original Mopar vehicles. We have been researching wheel weights for many years. However, we have not seen as many original examples as we would like from multiple years by production plant. However we are still conducting research.

Each supplier of weights has a slightly different shape to their weight by size. Most weights before 1971 only had the actual weight identified in oz.

Through the year the supplier of weights to various assembly plants was not consistent.



LH Callout	
6250	= 2.5 oz
6200	= 2.0 oz
6150	= 1.5 oz
1.0	= 1.0 oz
.5	= .5 oz

Supplier is LH in a diamond. This is the **most common** weight that we have from for most A,B,C,E,M,P body models from 1968 -73 weight. There is a 4 digit Id number on the weight as well as the actual weight in oz.



Supplier is DF. This weigh has been found on 1971-74 A bodies. The actual weight is called out in grams and oz.



Supplier is unknown but there is an image of a bear head on the weight. This is a common weight that we have from for many 1964 - 67 weigh models. There is a single letter ID number on the weight as well as the actual weight in oz.





Supplier is MICRO. This weigh has been found on various B, C,M,P bodies from 1971-74. The actual weight is called out in oz. only.



Supplier is unknown. This weigh has been found on various B,C,M,P bodies from 1968-70. The actual weight is called out in oz.



Supplier is S/C. This weigh has been found on various A,B, C,M,P bodies from 1967-70. The actual weight is called out in oz. only in a fraction.
